Health and Safety Commission Regular Meeting Minutes August 23, 2021

REPORTS FROM PRIORITY AGENCIES

- Beverly Hills Unified School District (BHUSD) BHUSD Governing School Board Member Honorable Mary Wells reported on the opening of schools, safety protocols for COVID-19 like testing and vaccination, and announced new Principal and Vice Principal for the elementary school.
- Beverly Hills Police Department Acting Police Captain Max Subin reported to the Commission about the Police Explorer Program, the assigned unit dedicated to the homeless population in the City, and quality of life topics like traffic nuisance and resident noise complaints. He spoke on facemasks and enforcement and the Department's Police Academy field training and hiring program.
- Beverly Hills Fire Department A-Shift Platoon Battalion Chief Timothy Hayes spoke on incidents and responses metrics, and strike team and deployment assignments. He spoke on structure fires and a wildland fire deployment system, the rapid extraction module support team (REMS).

1. Moment of Mindfulness

Commissioner Erica Felsenthal, PhD, led the Commission in a "Moment of Mindfulness" which teaches mental health, resiliency, and mindfulness techniques. This month's topic was the concept of mindful hydration.

The Health and Safety Commission honors an individual, business, or group who has demonstrated leadership in the field of health and safety, or has made a contribution to the mission of the Health and Safety Commission. For this meeting, Health and Safety Commissioner Rosenthal selected to acknowledge the efforts of EMS Administrator Sean Stokes for spearheading the initiative of the Beverly Hills Nurse Practitioner Program.
